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The Community

Bath is a city of 8,500 people located on the Kennebec River 10 miles inland from the Atlantic Ocean. Midway between Maine's largest city, Portland, and the capital, Augusta, Bath has a distinguished maritime heritage and is the home of Bath Iron Works, Maine's fifth largest employer. Morse serves as a regional high school for five rural communities: Arrowsic, Georgetown, Phippsburg, Woolwich, and West Bath.

The School

Morse High School is a comprehensive school with 635 students and a proud history dating back to 1858. It receives strong community support and has one of the largest, oldest and most active high school alumni associations in the country. The traditional college preparatory and honors programs are supplemented by the attached regional career and technology center; offering programs in Automotives, Carpentry, Commercial Arts, Culinary Arts, Engineering, Early Childhood Education, Electrical, Health Science and Welding. Morse competes in the Class B division in twenty sports and a wide variety of co-curricular and extra-curricular clubs and activities.
